BT Young Scientist Success for Coláiste Chiaráin



For the third consecutive year, Coláiste Chiaráin students have stood out in the BT Young Scientist Exhibition Awards ceremony in the RDS, Dublin which was held on Friday, January 13th. With a total of four entries in the competition this year, Coláiste Chiaráin walked away with three top prizes.

Seán O'Sullivan, a TY student, looked at "Investigating The Viability of Micro-Level Wind Generation" with his comprehensive project. Seán was awarded 3rd Place in the Individual Intermediate Technology category and was also the recipient of the Greencoat Renewables Technology Special Award.

Seán's project undertook an investigation on the impact of rotor design and orientation on Micro-Level Wind Generation efficiency. In this research Seán researched, designed, and 3D Printed 16 wind turbine rotors, 4 Motor Housing Assemblies, and 2 Arduino Data Capture Boards, and undertook a total of seven experiments. Testing was undertaken in the wind Tunnel at the University of Limerick as well as varied outdoor wind conditions.

As a result of this investigation and analysis of various known turbine blade designs, Seán's investigations highlighted a curved blade design that consistently outperformed all other categories of blades in both wind tunnel and outdoor conditions. This design performed on average 19% better than its nearest rival which was the traditional straight bladed rotor that we commonly see in domestic and commercial wind turbines.



Also prize winners on the evening were Aiden Osccar, Caitlin Quain and Katelyn Prior who were awarded a Display Award for their project, entitled, 'Wearable Device to Alert the user when UV index is high'. Through their research, the students noted that although skin cancer is the most common type of cancer in Ireland, over 50% of those surveyed don't wear sunscreen, with those who did only reapplying every four hours. The device, which can be worn like a watch, sends a reminder every 2 hours to top up sunscreen while also continuously monitoring the UV index.

Two further projects represented Coláiste Chiaráin at this prestigious competition with Matthew Furlong investigating "How to Make an Aircraft Invisible to Radar" and Emily Ceban researching "Using a Plasma Ball to Teach about Electric & Magnetic Fields".

Great credit is due to mentor teacher Ms. Edel Farrell for the work that she does in mentoring our students.

Congratulations to Seán on his excellent award in the Intermediate Category and to Aiden, Caitlin and Katelyn for their display award. Well done also to Emily and Matthew on their entries. Our students have been wonderful ambassadors for Coláiste Chiaráin and have done themselves proud, well done all!"

This was a wonderful opportunity to learn the similarities and differences of our two countries and there were plenty of opportunities to exchange ideas and make new friends. We brought the morning to a close with a brief demonstration of the skills involved in hurling, camogie and Gaelic football. We didn't miss the chance of challenging our guests to a short soccer match - and in true Irish spirit - we allowed them to win! A big thank you to Fernando Carro (ecolonias) for offering us this opportunity and also the TY students for their hard work involved in preparing for the visit.

COLÁISTE CHIARÁIN CONQUER AT FÉILE LUIMNIGH

Coláiste Chiaráin returned to Féile Luimnigh this year and won an impressive hoard of medals.

The Féile Luimnigh Speech and Drama competitions were held in Mungret College from Wednesday 18th January to Saturday 21st January. It is an annual Limerick based Arts and Cultural festival which aims to promote and encourage creative effort and practise in the arts of Speech, Drama, Singing and Instrumental Music.

Students ranging from Form II to Form IV entered a variety of competitions across the entire festival and were awarded for their performances. On Thursday Form III student Ben Costello won gold in the u18 Impromptu Speaking competition with Sarah Jane Noonan, Form III placing second. Ben was also awarded a Highly Commended certificate in the u16 solo verse competition. The following day they were delighted to see Amina Costello, Form II, win the u15 Impromptu Speaking competition. The success continued into Saturday where Form IV pupil Seán O'Sullivan took home the gold in the u18 Solo Verse competition.

Teacher Ms. Mary-Kate Hanley said that "the standard of the competitors was exceptionally high and I'm so proud of all the Coláiste Chiaráin students who gave wonderful performances. It's not easy getting up there in front of an audience! We are absolutely thrilled with the prizes we received and we are looking forward to next year already!"

Healthy Eating Recipies - Ms. Lynch



Ingredients:

100g jumbo porridge

50g sunflower seeds

50g pumpkin seeds

50g flaked almonds

50g hazelnuts

50g walnuts

3 tablespoons agave syrup/ honey

4 tablespoons of melted coconut oil

Pinch of salt

Method:

- 1. Preheat oven 180 degrees.
- 2. Mix all ingredients in a bowel.
- 3. Line a tray with parchment paper
- 4. Spread out ingredients evenly & 25 30 minutes until lightly roasted.
- 5. Turn occasionally to prevent burning.
- 6. Remove from oven and let to cool.
- 7. Place in airtight container & serve with yoghurt & fruit. Enjoy!

Super Berry Smoothie Serves 2

Ingredients:

225g raspberries225g blueberries1 ripe banana1 tbsp honey (optional)150 ml milk of choice150ml natural yoghurt



Method: (6 mins to prep)

- 1. Wash berries & place in blender

- 3. Pour in the milk & yoghurt to the blender.
