More Success at Debating



On Monday November 13th, 14 of Coláiste Chiaráin's transition year students set off on the schools annual American Exchange Programme, connecting Coláiste Chiaráin students with peers from Springford High School in Limerick, Pennsylvania. The program offers a unique opportunity for students to immerse themselves in American culture and education. 
PICTURE PERFECT
