Leargas eTwinning Award 2024

In November, European Studies Teacher Maeve O'Sullivan received a National Quality Label award from Leargas. The award was granted for two eTwinning projects undertaken by Form 1 and Form 2 students during the last academic year. The award is granted to teachers whose projects have reached a certain National and European standard. Our projects demonstrated excellence in each of the five categories of evaluation - and Ms. O'Sullivan was one of only 15 teachers in Ireland to reach this standard and be awarded an NQL from Leargas.

Form 1's project connected them to a school in Nardo in Italy where a shared genially.com was created and students on both sides shared information about school life and our countries.

Similarly, Form 2 students connected with students on the Island of Rhodes in Greece. Cards and letters were shared initially via traditional post and information was shared about life in both countries. This year's form two students have expanded the eTwinning project with Greece to include a school in Finland where information is being shared by the three schools on different aspects of nature in our countries. These eTwinning projects allow us to learn about our European neighbours and compare the different aspects as well as the similarities between us all. These projects are an integral part of European Studies.

Recycling at Coláiste Chiaráin

Coláiste Chiaráin has introduced a new "Bin Better" system in the school. Staff and students are asked to use the newly specifically designated bins. Assemblies were held for all year groups explaining how to use the 5 different types of bins. The benefits for doing this were explained and a questions and answers section followed allowing opportunities to clear up some of the confusion in this area. Discussions were held about the hierarchy of waste management. 1. Prevent, 2. Reduce, 3. Reuse. 4. Recycle and 5. Recover

We would encourage all members of the school community to use this system when in the school and beyond the school gates

5 Types of Bin

- General Waste: Grey label (if in doubt use this)
- Food: Brown Label (can also take compostable items)
- Recycling: Green label. CLEAN dry paper and plastic
- Re-turnables: Orange bin (cans and bottles with returnable logos
- **Batteries: Bin by entrance**






The Polytunnel
