
BT YOUNG SCIENTIST COMPETITION

The Show Must Go On with Coláiste Chiaráin's 'Our House'

With the matinee showing cancelled due to Storm Eowyn, the whole production were on tenterhooks waiting for the green light for the Friday night show to go ahead. Undeterred by such uncertainty, the cast and crew doubled down and, once the Friday show was confirmed, unleashed a sparkling blend of dance, song and some intricate storytelling.

'Our House' follows the story of Joe Casey, a sixteen year old boy who faces teenage choices and challenges, accompanied by bombastic songs such as 'It Must be Love', 'House of Fun' and of course, 'Baggy Trousers'. You could see young and old in the crowd bob their head in instant recognition of the classic tunes, and with the students giving it their all on stage, the show had something for everyone in the audience.

A striking feature of the production was the distinct range of performers on stage; from fledgling first years, to accomplished sixth years. Such a blend echoes the sense of community within the school, and the spirit in which the creative arts are supported and encouraged in Coláiste Chiaráin.
