Enjoy the read!



Young Innovators Speak Out Event

YSI students have three projects underway and presented to a panel of experts and hundreds of students at the YSI Speak Out event on March 12th in Cork City Hall.

'Senior Smiles' is a group that focuses on reducing elderly isolation. They have been collaborating with staff members to run after-school workshops for the elderly. So far, a group of over ten have completed an Art workshop with Mr. Delohery, a chair yoga class with Ms. Power and a baking class with Ms. O'Connor. This is an excellent initiative with great feedback so far.

'Light Up The City' is a group that is aiming to reduce suicide rates in Limerick City. So far, they have raised over 800 euro for Limerick Treaty Suicide Prevention. They also arranged for LTSP to come to the school and talk to all TY students about the importance of looking out for each other. Finally, they have also worked with the HSE Connecting for Life and Limerick City Council to get planning permission to redesign a bench in Arthur's Quay Park. This will be called a Hope Bench and will be colourful to raise moods, will have a positive formation and will have emergency contact numbers on it.

'Paws for Thought' is a group focusing on animal welfare. This group has completed a number of fundraisers for Limerick Animal Welfare - including a very successful dog treat bake sale. They made healthy snacks for dogs and sold them in school and in Croom College of Further Education.


AILO and ADAPT (who run this competition) use the results to search for future employees - those with an analytical mind who would be an asset in the area of Artificial Intelligence!
