#### LAUNCH OF THE HOPE BENCH

#### Light Up The City: Launch of the Hope Bench

On September 9th in Robert Byrne Park, Youth Social Innovators (YSI) students Jay Broe, Aoife Kelleher, and Ava Murphy officially launched the Hope Bench alongside LMHA's Buddy Bench project, with Mayor John Moran present.

Designed by local artist Kevin Maloney, the bench features calming blue tones, universal symbols of hope, and a powerful message: "There is hope." It also provides emergency contact details on a sign placed across from the bench. Furthermore, there is a QR code linking to the Limerick Mental Health Association website where people in need can find free support. More than just a seat, it has already become a landmark of hope in Limerick - offering reflection, support and connection.

The students' project was shortlisted to pitch at the Young Social Innovators of the Year Awards, and they raised over €1,000 for local mental health charities. Their work is already making a meaningful impact, reducing stigma and opening up conversations around mental health in our community.

This year, our current TY YSI students will continue the Light Up The City project, carrying forward its mission of compassion and hope. Thank you to Mr. Maloney for coordinating this project.

Held every year on 26 September, this day celebrates Europe's incredible linguistic and cultural diversity. It's all about encouraging language learning, appreciating different cultures, and having fun with communication – something our boules competition captured perfectly.

#### **Apprenticeship Culinary Taster Course**

TY students had the opportunity to partake in an "Apprentice Culinary Taster Course" in partnership with the Limerick & Clare ETB Further Education & Training Hub. This is a wonderful opportunity for students as they get to experience group cookery classes with professional chefs such as Mr. Tom Flavin. The programme runs every Wednesday from 9am to 1pm throughout the year in six week blocks. The classes consist of 12 students which are led by Chef Tom. Students get to witness and experience a professional skill set such as his, as well as develop their own skills each week. Students will make an array of dishes during the programme such as homemade granola, smoothies, spicy chicken burgers, curry and parsnip soup, sticky toffee pudding, chocolate chip cookies and brownies to name a few. This course endeavours to provide students with the necessary materials and mentorship to explore their potential culinary talents and the possibility of cheffing as a career path. It also enables students to build confidence in the kitchen and enter competitions at a regional level throughout the year.
